ADVENTURE CHALLENGE

The adventure challenge program at UPBC uses individual and group activities to facilitate growth through challenge. Adventure challenge includes group problem solving, teamwork, and personal challenge as avenues for personal and interpersonal growth.

Activity options include group initiatives, the climbing tower, and the high ropes course. Our instructors can make recommendations and help select activities designed around the needs and goals of your group. All activities will be facilitated and debriefed to foster learning in a safe and supportive atmosphere.



GOALS

Some common goals for an adventure challenge experience include improved communication, listening skills, confidence, trust, self-esteem, cooperation, and leadership. We can also design activities focused on your group's specific needs.

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ELEMENTS

Team Initiatives/Low Elements

Group initiatives are useful for building trust, learning to work as a team, assessing group communication patterns, and for building confidence before venturing onto the climbing tower and high ropes course. We have a variety of established group problem solving initiatives and love creating new ways to facilitate them to help groups meet their objectives.

Climbing Tower

The 40-foot climbing tower has challenges for every skill level. The tower has climbing routes where beginners ascend for the first time and other routes that stretch the limits of experienced climbers. The climbing tower is a great place to practice personal goal setting, to overcome fears, to learn to trust, and to encourage others.

High Ropes

The double-decker ropes course has elements at 15 and 30 feet off the ground, with seven different elements at each level. The elements vary in difficulty, so participants of different abilities can choose their level of challenge. Like the climbing tower, the high ropes course is a place where participants set goals, overcome fears, and push their limits, with the encouragement of others.
